Abbeydale Brewery - Sheffield

Daily Bread 3.8%

A well balanced copper coloured best bitter full of malty and subtle flavours finishing in a smooth bitter finish.

Atom Brewery – Hull, East Yorkshire

Dark Matter 4.5%

A rich creamy chocolate stout brewed with tons of oats and a touch of sea salt.

Black Hole Brewery – Little Eaton, Derbyshire

Lincoln Imperial Ale 3.8%

An exclusive copper coloured session bitter with a floral and malty aroma which was being brewed for the Small Beer Brewing Co. in Bermondsey, London.



Black Sheep Brewery – Ripon, North Yorkshire

Riggwelter 5.9%

A rich dark ruby ale with complex layers of coffee, bananas and liquorice combining for a classic Goldings hop finish.

Blue Monkey Brewery - Giltbrook

Nottinghamshire – Primate 4.0%

An amber coloured traditional best bitter with hints of chocolate and caramel plus an aroma of biscuit to end in a soft lingering bitterness.

Castle Eden Brewery - Seaham, Co. Durham

Castle Eden Ale 4.2%

Pale and Crystal malts give a distinct sweetness plus Styrian and East Golding hops give a distinctive fruity hop character.

Castle Rock Brewery - Nottingham

Preservation Fine Ale 4.4%

A traditional copper coloured full-flavoured best bitter with malt predominant and some residual sweetness plus a resinous hop character.

Cerne Abbas Brewery - Cerne Abbas, Dorset

Tiger Tom Ruby Mild 4.4%

A dark chestnut coloured ale with a malty, slightly smokey aroma and after an initial smoky taste, moves on to a malt sweetness and bitter hop finish.



Dancing Duck Brewery, Derby

Ay Up 3.9%

A session pale ale with subtle malt and floral notes, matched with a citrus hop taste then rounded off with a slightly dry finish.

Gloucester Brewery – Gloucester

Dockside Dark 5.2%

A velvety smooth and subtly sweet porter with a glorious aroma of coffee, chocolate and dark fruits.



Goddards Brewery – Ryde, Isle of Wight

Fuggle Dee Dum 4.8%

A tawny red premium ale, full of roasted hops and English Fuggle hops to give a smoky, spicy hoppiness on the nose.

Grey Trees Brewery – Aberdare, Wales

Drummer Boy 4.2%

A best bitter brewed with Crystal malt, roasted barley and Bramling Cross and Golding hops to give a smooth bitterness and a fresh fruit finish.

Island Brewery – Shalfleet, Isle of Wight

Anniversary Special – 24.1.71 6%

A special beer brewed for the Railway's 50th Anniversary, said to be a strong bitter brewed with Bramling hops.

Island Brewery – Shalfleet, Isle of Wight

Earls RDA 5.0%

A rich dark ale (R.D.A.) brewed with Crystal and Chocolate malts, together with roasted barley to give a glorious cappuccino aftertaste.

Island Brewery – Shalfleet, Isle of Wight

Wight Gold 4.00%

A golden brown coloured bitter with rounded Crystal malt and hops throughout.

Magpie Brewery – Nottingham

Raven Stout 4.4%

A rich smooth stout with a roast coffee aroma, packed full of roasted malt flavours with a little sweet smokiness, leading to a dry bitter finish.

Marble Brewery – Manchester

Pint 3.9%

A session ale brewed with 3 malts and 4 New Zealand and U.S. hops to give a burst of zesty aromas, grapefruit flavours and a subtle lemongrass finish.

Osset Brewery – Osset, West Yorkshire


Yorkshire Blonde 3.9%

A pale-coloured, full-bodied and well-rounded ale, slightly sweet on the palate, with a hoppy aroma.

Palmers Brewery – Bridport, Dorset

Tally Ho! 5.5%

A complex, dark coloured old ale where roast malts and treacle toffee on the palate lead to a long lingering finish with hints of coffee. Our Landlord's favourite tippie!



Pheasantry Brewery – Newark, Nottinghamshire

Best Bitter 3.8%

A well-balanced, copper coloured beer with fruity highlights and a hoppy finish.

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Pheasantry Brewery – Newark, Dancing Dragonfly 5%

A very pale golden ale packed with peachy exotic flavours.

Portobello Brewing – North Kensington, London Market Porter 4.4%

A dark chocolate premium porter with 8 different malts and 3 hops producing coffee and chocolate notes, a roasted caramel aroma and a beguiling depth of flavour.

Portobello Brewing – North Kensington, London Wemberly 4.5%

Brewed for the Euros with 4 malts and 5 hops including 'Wembley Mix Rye Grass' to produce an IPA type beer with grapefruit notes and a long bitter finish.

Purple Moose Brewery – Porthmadog, Wales Cwrw Ysgawen/ Elderflower Ale – 4.0%

A pale coloured, refreshing ale elderflower beer with a good citrus fruit aroma, bittersweet taste and a zesty, hoppy, mouth-watering finish.



Rooster's Brewery – Harrogate, North Yorkshire Baby Faced Assassin 6.1%

An IPA with aromas mango, apricot, grapefruit and mandarin with lasting, juicy, tropical fruit bitterness.

Rudgate Brewery – Tockwith, York, North Yorkshire – Ruby Mild 4.4%

A nutty, Rich, ruby coloured ale, stronger than usual for a mild.

Salopian Brewery – Hadnall, Shropshire – Darwins Origin 4.3%

A pale brown coloured ale in which hops and fruit dominate, where hops dominate the aftertaste with a pleasing lingering bitterness.

Stewart Brewing – Edinburgh, Scotland Stewart 80/- 4.4%

A traditional Scottish heavy with a complex profile dominated by malt with fruit flavours typical of this beer style and hops provide a gentle bitterness in the dry finish.



Thornbridge Brewery – Bakewell, Derbyshire Brother Rabbit 4.0%

A yellow coloured beer with a clean hoppy aroma with a resinous finish and some bitterness.

Titanic Brewery – Stoke-on-Trent, Staffordshire Plum Porter 4.9%

Dark brown in colour with a powerful fruity aroma where the sweet plum fruitiness gives way to a gentle bitter finish.

Totally Brewed – Nottingham – Papa Jangles Voodoo Stout 4.5%

A dark and chocolaty stout with complex malt flavours with cookies and cream and rum and raisin notes.

Wild Beer Brewery – Evercreech, Somerset Bible 4.2%

A pale ale with tropical fruits and mangoes which is unfiltered and therefore usually hazy.

Woodforde's Brewery – Woodbastwick, Norfolk Bure Gold 4.3%

A golden ale including hops from Slovenia and USA produces an orange and biscuit bouquet and the bittersweet hoppy beginning becomes a full-bodied marmalade ending.

Yates' Brewery – Newchurch, Isle of Wight – Islander 4.0%

A very easy drinking, amber coloured ale, brewed with Goldings and Chinook hops, giving a full bodied taste. amber coloured ale with a full bodied taste.
