As a living, breathing, working museum, Isle of Wight Steam Railway is a popular and fascinating destination for all age groups.

Beautifully restored Victorian and Edwardian carriages, often hauled by 19th century locomotives, can take school groups on a 10 mile journey through the Island's unspoilt countryside, and through stations showing different time periods of Isle of Wight railway history.

As a registered educational charity, our priority is to provide a positive learning experience for your students, in line with the National Curriculum.

We offer a range of learning opportunities, including a guided tour with train ride and a variety of educational workshops, enabling you to tailor your visit to the learning needs of your school group. Led by our Heritage & Learning Manager, who heads a team of knowledgeable and experienced volunteer School Guides, we can cater for educational groups from Reception up to Key Stage 5.

Guided Tour of Havenstreet Station and Train Ride

Key Stage: All Key Stages

Travel back in time with our tour of key sites at Havenstreet Station, including visiting the historic Station Yard area, our Carriage & Wagon Workshop, where an experienced team of staff and volunteers restore our heritage carriages and wagons, and our interactive Train Story Discovery Centre. This educational option also includes an audio-visual presentation (approx. 11 mins) on the history of railways on the Isle of Wight, and a 1 hour train ride aboard our restored carriages, often hauled by 19th century locomotives.

The Garden Isle by Train Key Stage: Key Stage I

Discover our 'seaside holidays' workshop, which explores why the Isle of Wight was, and still is, a tourist destination. Pupils will learn about key seaside locations on the Isle of Wight, and how visitors could visit them during the Golden Age of Seaside Holidays in the 1920s/30s. They can buy their train tickets to the Island's seaside stations using real old pennies. As Train Guards, they will organise Passenger Luggage in Advance and ensure carriages are ready for the tourists.

Curriculum Links (History): **Key Stage I**

- Develop an awareness of the past, using common words and phrases relating to the passing of time
- Know where the people and events they study fit within a chronological framework and identify similarities and differences between ways of life in different periods

Local Study - The History of the Isle of Wight Railways

Key Stage: Key Stage 2

Discover the history of railways on the Isle of Wight through a presentation, taking pupils from I 862 right up to the present day, across three key eras; Edwardian/ Victorian era, the Golden Age of Seaside Holidays (1920s/30s), and the preservation of steam railways. Pupils will handle real artefacts and create a Museum Object Record and Museum label.

World War Two -Evacuation to the Isle of Wight and the Role of Railways Key Stage: Key Stage 2

This workshop focuses on the journey of children evacuated to the Isle of Wight during World War Two, and how the railways were part of that journey. Through a short presentation and activities, pupils will follow the journey of evacuees from leaving home to arriving with their host family.
