PALE ALE

A light and refreshing, New Zealand pale ale showcasing the incredible Nelson Sauvin hops to give citrusy flavours with hints of gooseberry and white grape, balanced by the addition of a variety of other hops to give a crisp bitter finish.

BITTER

A malty, amber beer with some hoppy and fruit notes, leading to a sweet finish balanced by bitterness throughout.

A limited edition extra special/strong bitter created to celebrate 140 years of the original Reverend James brew, which is a bolder, more robust version with tasting notes of toffee and a rich maltiness.

STOUT

A roasted malt aroma, creamy flavours of chocolate dusted cappuccino with dark stone and dried fruit, and an increasing bitter aftertaste.

A smooth deep golden ale with subtle English hops and sweet Crystal malt, bringing a fresh honeyed character to this easy-drinking beer.

BITTER

A copper-coloured session bitter with a floral malty aroma.

MILD

A roasty dark mild with suggestions of forest fruits and dark chocolate, where a sweet taste leads to a more bitter finish.

OLD ALE

A complex old ale with roast malts and treacle toffee on the palate leading to a long lingering finish, with more than a hint of coffee.

STOUT

Velvety smooth with cakes of roasted malt, dark chocolate, and a subtle cherry tartness. Full-bodied and warming.

A nutty, rich, ruby ale, stronger than usual for a mild.
