# **HRA Privilege Card 2025 Now Available**

The HRA Privilege Card is for the exclusive use of working volunteers who currently work on UK heritage railways. It is valid for twelve months (March-February), and allows the pass holder, plus one accompanying person to travel on most heritage railways in the UK at either a reduced fare or, in most cases, free of charge. The accompanying person does not need to be a railway volunteer.

I am pleased to confirm that the cost of the pass for 2025/26 will be £42, so it only takes two or three visits to cover the cost!

You are now able purchase your card online, and you can do this via the /TeamAdmin page. If you are unable to purchase your card online then you can still pay for you HRA Privilege Card by cash, credit card, or cheque (made payable to the ISLE OF WIGHT RAILWAY CO. LTD) and sent to Liz King Sales & Marketing Assistant.

Please note that HRA Privilege Cards may not be purchased by or for family members or other persons who are not working volunteers.

A list of the participating railways (with their conditions if any), will be sent to you with your pass and is also available on the HRA website. Please bear in mind that some heritage railways may not give free travel during their special events, so it is a good idea to check with your chosen railway before visiting! It is hoped that when visiting other railways you will support them by spending in their cafeteria and/or shop!

The Heritage Railway Association (HRA) is our "umbrella" or "trade" organisation, which supports and advises member railways. The £42 charge for the Privilege Card goes towards the costs of running the organisation, and helps keep our annual subscription to the HRA as low as possible.

# **Rail Infrastructure Update**

The latest from the Rail Infrastructure Team

With the operating season scheduled to begin in February this year, this month provided the last monthly working weekend free of train operations. Therefore, the opportunity arose to carry out the annual session of Fishplate Maintenance. After the successful use of the battery powered wrenches last year, a third one has been procured to act as backup. A petrol powered machine will also be in attendance as a further reserve.

Wootton station was the location for January's slightly delayed Working Weekend, a couple of tasks on the platform road were the target for the gang over the two days. There was a slight delay in arriving at Wootton when the pre-loaded rail trolley had to be decanted into the Company van for the trip to Wootton. Frozen points at Havenstreet being the cause.

The track in the loco release road had been recovered earlier in the week, so the excavator was able to start removing the dirty, chocked ballast first thing. Given the restricted area, the Road Railer with a bucket attachment was used to move the spoil to a place further down the run round loop. While the digging was going on, the recovered sleepers had their chairs removed which were then fitted to one side of the replacement sleepers. When all the ballast had been removed the new sleepers could spaced out along the length of the loco release.

In the afternoon the two panels of track at the ramp end of the platform road were removed, allowing a start to be made removing the top stone to expose the formation. The platform side rail in the loco release was also refitted, plated and keyed up by the end of the day.

Sunday saw a slightly smaller gang in attendance, which soon split into two. One group repaired to the hole at the ramp end of the platform to continue the excavation to investigate the cause of a persistent weak spot. The remainder fitted the second chair to the sleepers in the loco release siding, which involved drilling and screwing each one down to the correct gauge. The rail could be fitted after dinner, and once keyed up, four bags of fresh, clean stone were run in before being spread about by shovel. The excavating by the ramp was proceeding well, and the expected clay came into view in the early afternoon.

Many thanks to everyone who helped out over the weekend.

Since the last Working Weekend the main task has been to complete the formation work at the Havenstreet end of Wootton station platform. The clean ballast being removed to reveal the condition of the formation below. As expected this proved to include a quantity of clay, which is very common at Wootton. This was removed to the embankment side by excavator and crushed concrete was used to refill the opening created to a level to allow for a depth of ballast below the sleeper bottoms.

With the ballast reinstated the two panels of track were relaid before being given a final lift to the correct level relative to the platform.

While the excavating was going on, some lifting and packing was carried out on the relaid loco release and selected parts of the run around loop.

The Friday Gang continue their sterling efforts on the lineside. At present they are working in Briddlesford Woods, towards Wootton from the remains of Bridge Twelve.
